Pastoral Search Committee Update

At the Annual Meeting in September, the congregation voted on two amendments. **First vote** was on the amended motion. "*Rev. Rick Reed be given first consideration in the Search Committee's process.* The motion passed 47-2

Second vote was on the amended motion *"Form a Search Committee to use American Baptist resources to find a candidate to present to the congregation to be our settled pastor and that Reverend Rick Reed be given first consideration.* The motion passed 42-10

Throughout October, the Church Council selected 7 people to be on the Search Committee: Janet Hillenbrand, Jan Kublick, Mark Guttendorf, Peter Huntington, Hugh Reed, Kathleen Randall and Laura Rankin. We also have Rev. Leon Oakes-Lee as our counselor from the ABC.

Our first meeting was on Nov. 15 where Ann Sedore gave us the documents and outline we would need for our journey. She gave us a goal date, the end of the first quarter. (March 31) We met weekly on Zoom right up until Dec. 22 and resumed again on Jan. 6th.

Our mission was pretty simple...prepare a job proposal for Rick Reed. Many of us were true optimists and were hoping to get this package together, put a bow on it and offer it to Rick just before Christmas. But, were realized that this process had to be done properly, not quickly. We must follow the guidelines of our Church Constitution and the ABC. One resource that Leon gave us was guide titled, "Calling a Settled Pastor." That, guide was 120 pages. We also found that we had to work hand-in-hand with the Personnel Relations Board and the Church Council. It was also important to put together a job offer that was well thought out and appealing. If this was a job that we put in the Want Ads of the newspaper, would a candidate circle it?

We needed to put together a package which includes three facets. A Church Profile, a Compensation Package and Pastoral Position Description.

- The Church Profile is a serious look at who we are as a church. What we stand for, our history, what worked in the past, what is not working and where we want to be in the future. That could behave been a time-consuming process in itself but we were lucky that the Transition Team had done most of the work on that matter last year.
- The Compensation Package went together rather smoothly and we have sent it on to the PRB for approval. There will be items to be ironed out but that would include Rick's input.

• The Pastoral Position Description came from the PRB. We did have some concerns about it because it seemed a little too task oriented. It had been modified for a pastor who was new to the position and not necessary for someone who has 40 years of experience. With Bob Cooper's guidance, the PRB made the changes and quickly got the document back to us over the Christmas break. We approved the pastoral description and the Church Profile and sent them on to the Church Council.

Our final step includes a "soft interview" with Rick to see if there are any more questions and to see if Rick has questions. We did invite Rick to one of our earlier Zoom meetings. We asked him questions and he shared his thoughts about the Church Profile and the Pastoral Position Description. When you think of it, Rick has been interviewing for almost 3 years! Then, you, the congregation have a task to complete. The Search Committee can only present a candidate. The congregation still has to vote.

During this time of Epiphany, I am seeing many analogies to this Time of Light.

The Search Committee, well, we are the Wise men/women. We see the star; we know where the star is. We just need to follow the process to get to the star. That means we need to take the proper path. The story has it that the Wise Men did not arrive in Bethlehem almost 2 years later. Of course, it won't take us that long. We are not lost in the desert. We are confident that we will have our job done by the end of the first quarter.

When you travel in the desert, you need to use a camel and not a Corvette. We will get to our destination.
