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From the Moderator

At a special congregational meeting held April 25, 2021, members voted to call Pastor Richard G. Reed to serve as TUCC's part-time, settled Pastor. Fifty-six active members attended the meeting in person and four joined the meeting via Zoom.

The meeting began with a congregational prayer asking for divine guidance while making this vital decision. The careful steps taken by the Church Council over the last three years to prepare for pastoral selection were outlined. Laura Rankin, chair of the Search Committee, provided an overview of the five months of committee work leading to their final recommendation.

The floor was opened for questions directed to Reverend Reed. Written questions were addressed and concerns about church growth and visitation were expressed. Reverend Reed left after all questions were addressed.

The congregation had an opportunity to hear concerns about the selection process and to dialogue about any congregational observations or issues surrounding the search or the Search Committee recommendations.

Voting was completed by written ballot and private Zoom voting. The Church Treasurer and Financial Secretary coordinated vote counting and reported that the motion to call Reverend Reed was carried.

Reverend Reed was given a standing ovation when he returned to hear the outcome of the meeting.

Baptist and Methodist Annual Meetings

The Summit is scheduled online June 24-26, 2021. Delegates must have the church code for registering. An unlimited number of members and attendees of every church may be a part of the worship, learning and coming together as American Baptists.

From The Pastor

Well, this marks the first FROM THE PASTOR that is from your new *settled* pastor! I left pastoral ministry in 1995 and went into the "mission field" of social case work, first through the Cortland County then Tompkins County Dept. of Social Services. I never felt that I left ministry; rather that my ministry was focused in a different realm. Direct casework with individuals and families in crisis with crippling dysfunction, mental and cognitive disability, in trouble with the law, and in need of permanency was very fulfilling and I did that work for 22 years. I always endeavored to treat each client with dignity and respect, even in the worst cases that I managed, always looking for that spark of common humanity, that flash of the Imago Dei and I am very proud of my service to Cortland and Tompkins County residents. Along the way I had opportunities to fill in for pastors in pulpit supply and to perform the occasional wedding or funeral. I "blame" my friend, (Pastor) Keith for gently pulling me back into the role and functions of pastoral ministry; doing supply preaching, concelebrating communion, helping to lead in worship. Upon Pastor Keith and Janice's retirement and my becoming the interim pastor here, I found that I needed to brush some rust off my pastoral ministry tools and hone the edges. And I continued to do so after Pastor Doug left. It's always a work in progress! The support and encouragement that I have received from this congregation have been more than sufficient; they have been at times overwhelming. I thank you all for that.

As we were preparing to call a new pastor after Wimmersburger's moved, we had a congregational survey and one of the questions was to list the top three expectations we had of a pastor. I will tell you my answer: 1. Love the people. 2. Love the people. 3. Love the people. I have clocked-in over 3 ½ years as your interim; the first time being 9 months and this second time being one month shy of 3 years. We have worked together, struggled together, prayed together. I have loved this congregation through it and will continue to love, serve, and give my best to the people of Tully United Community Church and to the Tully Community. I ask your patience, your grace, your prayers, and your love and assure you of mine in return.

This passage from the Apostle Paul's letter to the church at Philippi is a good pattern for all of us as we begin a new chapter together:

Philippians 3:12-14 (The Message)

I'm not saying that I have this all together, that I have it made. But I am well on my way, reaching out for Christ, who has so wondrously reached out for me. Friends, don't get me wrong: By no means do I count myself an expert in all of this, but I've got my eye on the goal, where God is beckoning us onward—to Jesus. I'm off and running and I'm not turning back.



You can make on-line donations right from tullychurch.org. If you go to tullychurch.org you will see a Donate button on the right-hand side of the main site page.

a. When you click the button, you will see the following page:



- b. Enter the amount you want to donate. For example, for \$10.00 enter 1-0-0-0. A 2-digit decimal point is assumed.
- c. Important: You do NOT need to have a paypal account to donate. You can use any standard Credit card or debit card;
 - 1. If you DON'T have a paypal account click on "Donate with a Debit or Credit Card"
 - 2. If you do have a Paypal account, you can click on "Donate with PayPal".
