FROM THE PASTOR – REV. RICHARD G. REED

Living in a new home brings lots of new experiences and one that I can't help but notice is the corn growing on two sides of the parsonage! I grew up on a country block with a big barn and pasture land behind our house. But that was one side, and it was down a slope, and it was cows and donkeys, not corn, and the other three sides were houses. In the parsonage the corn is creeping up the horizon – it's wonderful, and different. If only it was sweet corn... Well, the corn was certainly knee high by the Fourth of July and soon I'll be singing: "The corn is as high as an elephant's eye, An' it looks like its climbin' clear up to the sky."

Planting is our task as Christians. Watering is also our task when the ground gets too dry and the rain doesn't come. I'm reminded of the words of the Apostle Paul in his First Letter to the Church at Corinth:

"I planted, Apollos watered, but God made it grow. Because of this, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but the only one who is anything is God who makes it grow. The one who plants and the one who waters work together, but each one will receive their own reward for their own labor." 1 Corinthians 3:6-8

Back in the 1800's groups of Christians of the Baptist and of the Methodist persuasions got together and established churches. And eventually they had buildings right next to one another. And they worked in the fields of Tully – sometimes separately and sometimes together. And they found eventually that they were working more together than separately. So fifty years ago they decided to pool their resources together and combine into one United church to serve the Community of Tully and in July 1971, the Tully United Community Church was born! Two strong congregations that didn't merge just to survive for self, but united in order to prosper together preaching, teaching, and doing the will of God.

This is a good reminder for us as we move forward. Like the church at Corinth, we have a particular crop to plant – the Good News of God's grace and love and welcome through our Lord Jesus Christ. Our activities are not for ourselves, not for our own survival, but to water, through our preaching, teaching and doing, the good seed of God's Word. And it is God who will give us the increase. So with patience and kindness and care toward one another, we work together in God's field here at the Tully United Community Church. And we look for the reward of the next fifty years and beyond as we are blessed by God in our efforts.

SPEAKING OF THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY...

The Tully United Community Church held its first worship service together on Sunday June 26, 1971. The petition of the North Church and the South Church to merge was signed July 12, 1971 and the two churches were incorporated into TUCC on July 14, 1971. We plan a week of celebration beginning on September 12 and culminating with a memorial walk and service of celebration on September 19. A free community dinner is planned for Saturday, September 18 and we hope to have some activities during the week between.

In this 50th anniversary year, we remember that **the carillon holds the bells from the Methodist and Baptist church steeples**. Only one of the bells can be rung and both are in need of repair. **The estimate is a little over \$8000**. Wouldn't it be great to have them back up and ringing for the 50th Anniversary Celebration? Well we have been selling little bells as a fundraiser and have made over \$3000 so far but with still a long way to go. There are still a few anniversary bells that have the carillon printed on them and there is a plan to sell unprinted bells later in the year. Any other ideas?

TUCC Annual Meeting

The annual meeting of the Tully United Community Church membership is scheduled for **August 15, 2021 at 10:45 in the sanctuary**. Preparation for this meeting has started and one focus is on developing a slate of officers and board members. The work of TUCC requires that members with God-given talents and passion join with the Pastor in living the church's mission and values.

There will be a vote to fill all church leadership positions: Moderator, Church Clerk, Church Treasurer, Church Assistant Treasurer, Financial Secretary, and Assistant Financial Secretary. The term of all elected church officers is one year with a term limit of three years. The current moderator, treasurer and financial secretary are eligible to serve another year. The remaining position have been vacant throughout the 2020-2021 year.

In addition, the membership will be presented with a slate of Board members for consideration. Currently, Boards are finalizing the 2021-2022 slate and all are seeking new members to add energy and vision. Over the next few weeks of church services, members of each Board will peak about the challenges and rewards of board service. After the service, there will be an opportunity to talk with board members and ask question.

Ride and Run for the Rescue 2021


