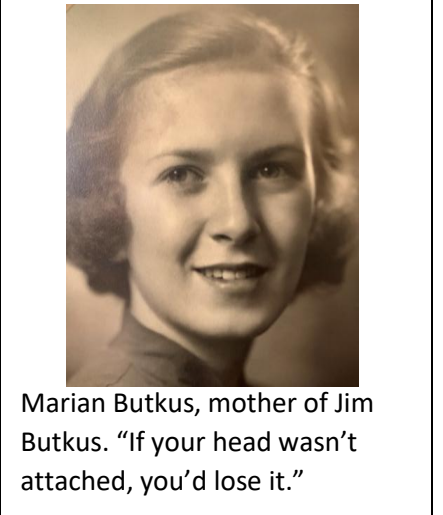


Moms to Mark and Bernice
