

FROM THE PASTOR

It is an exciting moment in the life and history of our congregation. 50 years of living, ministering, and caring for one another and our community. Together.

I interviewed Rusty and Lorrie Spaulding during worship on August 29, and I asked what it was that got the two congregations, Baptist and Methodist, to come together as one congregation. Lorrie said that they both had some financial challenges as separate churches, did a lot of things together already, like Vacation Bible School, Pastoral Vacation coverage, and such, and they all knew one another and were comfortable with one another, and – this is the important part – the two churches shared a driveway. When there is a small parking lot to share and a common driveway that needs to be plowed in the winter, you must of necessity learn to get along! The two congregations figured out how to maintain a common driveway without fighting over it, so they figured they could live together as a merged church, one congregation, each and every member both 100% Baptist and 100% Methodist. It helped that this was during a time of increasing ecumenical involvement between the Protestant denominations and with the Catholic Church. And while the ecumenical movement has atrophied in these subsequent decades, our congregation continues the grand ecumenical experiment in wedding the polity and practices of two distinct religious movements into one united church.

Lorrie told me later that when the newly forged church was considering a name for the newsletter, she was aware that there were struggles and difficulties that the congregation was endeavoring to overcome – things like how to serve communion and even how often, what hymnal to use, where they would worship (before the new building was built). She said she thought of the importance of stepping stones to form a simple bridge or causeway that allows a pedestrian to cross an area that would be otherwise difficult to forge across. Thus, the name of our congregational newsletter, The Stepping Stone, was born.

A common driveway that led to a common faith community and a common mission and ministry. Stepping Stones that bridge the differences between people and encourage us to cross together whatever difficulties and challenges come our way. Are you as excited about the next 50 years together as I am?


School Supplies - A big "thank you" to all.
