

FROM THE PASTOR – MARCH 2022

John 1:1-5 Common English Bible

In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. The Word was with God in the beginning. Everything came into being through the Word, and without the Word nothing came into being. What came into being through the Word was life, and the life was the light for all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness doesn't extinguish the light.

In the midst of our worries over the world-wide coronavirus pandemic comes a new worry, a new danger: the invasion of Ukraine by the Russian military. Our hearts, our prayers, and our resources are with the Ukrainian people, David facing a mammoth Goliath, as the conflict threatens to spill over into Europe and even the rest of the world. We have plenty to pray about during our Lenten discipline. The darkness appears to be increasing. Fear threatens.

The Gospel of John opens with a word of strong faith and hope, as printed above. "What came into being through the Word was life, and the life was the light for all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness doesn't extinguish the light." The word "light" is very important in this poetic passage. But for this missive, I want to focus on the word "extinguish." It is most commonly rendered "overcome" but the word in Greek, $\kappa\alpha\tau\alpha\lambda\alpha\mu\beta\alpha\nu\omega$ (katalambanō) can have the following meanings: to lay hold of, grasp; to obtain, attain, <u>Rom. 9:30; 1 Cor. 9:24; Phil. 3:12, 13;</u> to seize, to take possession of, <u>Mk. 9:18;</u> to come suddenly upon; overtake, surprise, <u>Jn. 12:35; 1 Thess. 5:4;</u> to detect in the act, seize, <u>Jn. 8:3</u>, <u>4</u>; to comprehend, apprehend, <u>Jn. 1:5;</u> to understand, perceive, <u>Acts 4:13; 10:34; 25:25; Eph. 3:18</u>.

John wants us to know that there will always be dark forces at work trying to extinguish the Light. The darkness that lies in the hearts of human beings may try to surprise and overtake. The darkness of violence, greed, and lust for power doesn't understand the Light. It tries to lure us in and seize our way of thinking and acting. But this darkness will never overcome the Light. The Word, the Light, the Power of Almighty God will always overcome the darkness. John encourages us to a Hope that frees us from the paralysis of fear and helps us bear witness to the grace, the love, the powerful life-giving presence of our Lord Jesus Christ.

May the Light of the Eternal Word, even Jesus Christ our Lord, enlighten your path this Lenten season.
