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#### FROM THE PASTOR

I ran across this article that I wrote in 2019. And as our Lenten Book Study is on the Lord's Prayer, and a major part of that prayer is "Forgive us our sins (debts/trespasses), as we forgive those who sin against us", I felt it was worthy of running it again.

During this season of Lent, I have pondered if there is a single act of Jesus that makes us who we are and tells us how to behave? I have decided that it really is forgiveness. Jesus poured out his life to show a different way to understand God and God's grace and love. Jesus challenged the traditional values of religion and called people to a renewed sense of belonging to God and to God's universe. And in the end, the religious and civil leaders rejected his ministry and he was condemned to die a cruel death on a cross, hung between two criminals. And yet, as he hung there, slowly dying, he called out to God, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." We who call ourselves by the name of Christ are to do no less.

People make mistakes. Christians, like everyone else, treat one another badly at times and fail to live up to what we believe is the ideal. We fail to be Christ-like in our behavior. But it is the act of forgiveness that sets us apart. We are not a people who say, "Well, you did me wrong once, but you won't do it again!" or "You just wait – I'll get even!" We are a people who, with Christ, say, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do."

Now forgiveness is not an easy road. I dare say it is one of the hardest to walk. And forgiveness is not forgetting. When another has offended us, it is something that lasts in the memory a long time. And while it may fade in intensity with time, it likely will never completely go away. Nor do we need for the other person change – forgiveness involves an attitude of change of the self. To hold a grudge, to not let go of the hurt and anger, will only eat away at *you* and destroy *you*. It isn't going to do a bit of good to the one you believe offended you.

I believe that we practice forgiveness before our heart believes it. I shared in a recent sermon about a former supervisor who I felt had wronged me. For months I didn't talk to her or even acknowledge her when our paths crossed. And I finally realized that this was only eating at me. Yes, trust was broken, but now I was adding another layer on top of it that created bitterness inside of me. So I began making myself give her a half-smile when we passed in the hallway. Then a quick "Morning". Then a "How are you today." Finally we got to a place where we were talking again and later, we were able to process what happened and to reach a mutual place of understanding and acceptance.

We who call ourselves Christians are about to celebrate that event that is the central part of our faith – the resurrection of Jesus from death to life. And resurrection isn't only about what happens after we die. It is also about new life in the here and now. It is a rehearsal of what is to come. Forgiveness is that attitude that prepares us for new life, new relationships, new understanding. So, let's practice what we preach!
