#### FROM THE PASTOR – DECEMBER 2021

Seems like we always say it – "This year went so fast; where did the time go?" And 2021 is no exception. We continue to struggle with the Coronavirus – its devastation and dis-ease. We are back to mask mandates and yet another variant is spreading through the world. Some are struggling to schedule a booster while others are still not convinced that vaccination is wise for them or for their children. Others may ask God in their prayers why God isn't doing something to end this. I believe that the God who created the universe and made science as a way to understand and interact with the creation, has given us the vaccinations to help us end this and daily increases our understanding of this and other illnesses. At any rate, the COVID plague still plagues us as we near year two of it. And as we near the end of 2021, over 800,000 of our citizens have died because of it.

Perhaps Merry Christmas and Happy New Year are a little more difficult to utter this years' end. Maybe happier than last year, but still, disease, violence, environmental crisis, hate – it seems that they are all on the rise. In fact, the bells began to peal as I wrote these sentences and I paused for the full minute just to listen. They are uplifting and joyful. And so should we be.

Any change in the culture comes with a change in our individual attitudes. Wonderful things are happening here at TUCC – we are moving forward into ministry, into service projects, into fixing things, into embracing people. And in every way God is lifting us up, blessing us, challenging us, renewing us as a congregation. So we bring 2021 to a close and we face the challenges of 2022. And whatever may come, we affirm with the Apostle Paul: *"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:4-7*

# **Two Church Boards Request Additional Members**

As TUCC moves into another busy year, two of the Church Boards are asking that you consider joining in their work: The Board of Christian Education and the Board of Personnel Relations. Each has a vital role in the ongoing health of the church. Following are the duties of each defined in the Church constitution. If you are interested or have questions, please contact Rev, Rick Reed or Ann Sedore.

The Board of Christian Education shall:

- A. Prepare and administer programs approved by the Church Council that will effectively provide Christian Education at all age levels.
- B. Administer adult workshops and youth ministry.

The Board of Personnel Relations shall:

- A. Foster constructive communications between the congregation and its pastoral leadership and implement the congregation's responsibility for its pastor's professional and personal well-being.
- B. Annually join with the pastor in an evaluation of pastoral effectiveness in the context of the Church's Total Ministry.

- C. Determine the need for, and upon Church Council approval, hire, and retain all staffing.
- D. Foster constructive communications between the congregation and all paid staff.
- E. Annually join with each paid staff member in an evaluation of the staff member's effectiveness in the context of the Church's Total Ministry.
- F. Provide information and make recommendations on all pastoral and staff salaries and benefits, and make recommendations to the Church Council.
- G. Support a Pastoral Search Committee whenever there is a need for pastoral staffing.
- H. Support Pastoral Internships as available to the Church, and assist the Pastor in evaluating a Pastoral Intern's effectiveness in the powers and responsibilities assigned by the Pastor and approved by the Church Council.

#### Monthly Family Sunday to Start in January

Starting on the first Sunday in January, TUCC will start again to celebrate Family Sunday. Once a month, children will remain with their families during the entire Sunday Service. TUCC believes that children need to learn about the importance of group worship by participating in it. Here are a few things we know:

Children need to learn about worship and communion from family and our congregation. We are in this together. We believe that practice, explanation, and tolerance is necessary to teach busy toddlers, curious, questioning kids, and restless, preoccupied teens about the importance and meaning of group worship.

The Church needs to provide guidance to parents and church members about what to say to children of all ages and each other about worship and its components. In the next few months, materials will be made available to help us all with this work.

We love our children and want to join together to let them know this.
