From The Pastor – July 2023

For the next few Sundays of July, the Common Lectionary has us out in the fields planting seeds and watching for growth. The entire season of Pentecost is about growth, but these next few weeks bring us close to the agrarian world view of Jesus and his followers. And we who live in a rural setting have an advantage when these scripture lessons come up – we live it every day!

Not that every one of us is a farmer. But many of us do grow plants in a small garden. And even if we don't, farming is so much a part of who we are as a community together that we are greatly influenced in our thinking, speaking, and living.

"You can plant corn until the 20th of June" and "Knee high by the Fourth of July!" are pretty common phrases to us, and as we approach Independence Day each year, just about all of us are looking at corn fields to determine just how high the corn has grown. While we started off in the Spring with a bit of a draught, the rain has been falling pretty regularly and the corn was, indeed, Knee High by the 4th!

In First Corinthians 3:6-8 the Apostle Paul tells the church at Corinth:

My job was to plant *the seed,* and Apollos was called to water it. Any growth comes from God, so the ones who water and plant have nothing *to brag about*. God, who causes the growth, is the only One who matters. The one who plants is no greater than the one who waters; both will be rewarded based on their work.

Jesus' stories and Paul's example tell us that we are all farmers in God's Kingdom. We each have a job to plant seeds of kindness, justice, peace, and inclusion and to water these seeds with grace, mercy, compassion, and hope. As long as we are doing our job as good gardeners, God will cause the growth.

So keep digging, keep planting, keep watering! A farmer's work is never done!

Moderator Message

Church Council Calls TUCC Annual Meeting

August 6, 2023 10:45am

The Annual Meeting of the Tully United Community Church will be held Sunday, August 6, 2023 at 10:45 in the sanctuary. Zoom attendance will be available. A quorum of 10% of active church members is needed to conduct business of the church.

The Annual Report for the program year will be available the by August 1st and will be emailed to members. Please print your own copy; bring it with you to the Annual Meeting.

The Board reports, the proposed budget, and a slate of officers and board members will be presented for members' consideration and voting.

Four proposed changes to the TUCC Constitution will be presented for Congregational vote. Amendments to this Constitution require a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the qualified voters present at the meeting. An article outlining the proposed changes is included in this edition of Stepping Stone.

Please let Ann Sedore, Moderator know if you would like other items added to the Annual Meeting Agenda.

Proposed Changes to the TUCC Constitution August, 2023

The Church Council is proposing changes to the four sections of the TUCC Constitution. Amendments to this Constitution require a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of the qualified voters present at the annual meeting. As required in the constitution the proposed changes follow. Questions about the proposed changes may directed to any member of the Church Council.

Proposal 1: Replace Article II with an updated Mission and add Core Values

Remove current Purpose Statement

ARTICLE II – Purpose (CURRENT)

"The purpose of the Tully United Community Church is to Faithfully present the Gospel of Jesus Christ to Persons, Groups and Institutions, encouraging them to

Respond in faith and love, Live the Christian Life Style, Discover the depth relationships of Christian Fellowship, And become change agents promoting Justice, Human Dignity, and a Sense of Community."

To fulfill this Purpose we shall provide:

- 1. Preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ;
- 2. Christian Education at all age levels;
- 3. Christian Service within this Church and the Church Universal;
- 4. Christian Witness and Mission within and beyond the community of Tully;
- 5. Christian Fellowship;
- 6. Financial support for the Church's Work; and
- 7. Facilities which support the Church membership and programs.

To achieve our Christian mission, we are committed to a positive mode of growth and development. A variety of programs will be used to continually reach out and serve the ever-increasing needs of the growing community and world. We place no restrictions on the type of programs we may undertake in response to these needs

Replace with the Mission Statement which is currently posted on TUCC website and add Core Values identified by church members lead by the Transition Team in 2019

ARTICLE II: Our Mission and Values

The mission of the Tully United Community Church is to be an inclusive community of faith, proclaiming the message of God's love in the teachings of Jesus Christ through worship, teaching and service.

We are an ecumenical fellowship of Christians who believe in God and who seek to follow Jesus in discipleship. Our history includes two specific denominational families: the American Baptists and the United Methodists. While we affirm and maintain our ties to these expressions of Christian witness, we seek to be open to all people who seek to love God and live out their life of faith among us.

Our unity celebrates a diversity of gifts and thinking which leads us to open our hearts and minds and doors to all who enter.

We have no creeds or doctrinal formula to which our members must ascribe, but rather believe in a God given freedom of conscience in regard to matters of religious faith.

Our prayer is that at worship we will catch a glimpse of God's meaning, purpose and direction for our lives and hopefully discover a new centering presence for our daily living.

Our program life is one which seeks to minister to community needs that we might be a benefit and blessing to all who come through our doors.

Our Core Values

We believe that an environment that promotes loving relationships and belonging is critical for meaningful worship and spiritual growth. We are committed to be accepting, caring, welcoming, helping, and inclusive.

We believe that a vital, God-center church finds multiple ways to reach out and support community. We are committed to understanding and serving community needs.

We believe that a church that promotes spiritual growth and loving relationship produces a congregation characterized by peace, harmony, and joy.

We believe that Christians thrive in a church committed to growth and learning. We are committed to Bible study, questioning, dialogue, and skills development through real life experience.

Proposal 2: Add Dual/Associate Membership option to Membership Section. (Additions in red)

ARTICLE IV – Membership

<u>Section 1.</u> Membership in this Church shall be open to any person:

- A. Who has been baptized and confirmed; or been baptized by immersion; or
- B. Who has made a "Profession of Faith" in God, the Scriptures, and the Bible; or
- C. Who has transferred their membership by letter from any Christian Church.

<u>Section 2.</u> Each member must affirm that he or she will be a responsible person in the matters of church attendance, financial support, and the use of his or her talents for the betterment of the Church.

Section 3. Dual/Associate Membership shall be open to any person

- A. Who has been baptized and confirmed; or made a "Profession of Faith in God, the Scriptures, and the Bible;
- B. Who has been associated with denominations other than the American Baptist Churches/USA or the United Methodist Church; and
- C. Who wishes to be under the care, accountability, and partnership of this faith community, but does not wish to change their denominational affiliation or withdraw membership from another Church

Section 4. The Board of Mission and Outreach shall maintain a membership roll which designates both regular and dual/associate members. The list will also designate each listed member as active or inactive. Members may request at any time, in writing that their status as a member be changed (e.g., from active to inactive or vice versa); however, the Board of Mission and Outreach is authorized to make the final determination as to whether a member is designated as active or inactive. Members will be notified in writing when membership status is being changed. The membership roll shall be regularly updated to reflect changes in membership and membership status. In addition, the Board of Mission and Outreach shall conduct a census, or survey, at least once every five years, which will request that each active member or dual/associate member (1) specify whether he or she desires to be designated as active or inactive; and (2) provide current contact information and any information the member wishes to provide regarding birthdays, anniversaries and family makeup. In conducting the census, the Board of Mission and Outreach shall use multiple methods to contact to maximize responses.

Proposal 3: Change current statements defining term limits for Church Officers and Board Members.

Article VI: Church Organization

Section 1: Officers

The six Church Officers shall be elected from the Membership of the Church at the Annual Meeting for one (1) year terms, and may not serve for more than (3) consecutive terms. Terms may be extended in one year increments if qualified replacements cannot be identified.

Section 7: Boards

The Boards shall consist of a reasonable number of members as is required to complete their duties, with consideration given to the balanced representation of men and women, to be elected from the church membership at an Annual Meeting for a stated term of three (3) years.

Board members may not succeed themselves, but may be re-elected after the expiration of one year from the end of their term of office. Terms may be extended as needed to ensure adequate Board size and appropriate experience and expertise.

Proposal 4: Add one new function to The Board of Personnel Relations (addition in red)

Section 12: The Board of Personnel Relations

The Board of Personnel Relations shall:

- A. Foster constructive communications between the congregation and its pastoral leadership and implement the congregation's responsibility for its pastor's professional and personal well-being.
- B. Annually join with the pastor in an evaluation of pastoral effectiveness in the context of the Church's Total Ministry.
- C. Determine the need for, and upon Church Council approval, hire, and retain all staffing.
- D. Foster constructive communications between the congregation and all paid staff.
- E. Annually join with each paid staff member in an evaluation of the staff member's effectiveness in the context of the Church's Total Ministry.
- F. Provide information and make recommendations on all pastoral and staff salaries and benefits, and make recommendations to the Church Council.
- G. Support a Pastoral Search Committee whenever there is a need for pastoral staffing.
- H. Support Pastoral Internships as available to the Church, and assist the Pastor in evaluating a Pastoral Intern's effectiveness in the powers and responsibilities assigned by the Pastor and approved by the Church Council.
- I. Oversee payment for substitute personnel and temporary staff.

The Lillian Bigsby Ladies Circle recently completed two Brother Keeper's sleeping bags for the Rescue Mission. Inside each sleeping bag we put sweat pants, sweat shirt, socks, gloves, hat, and a cut up heavy garbage bag to place beneath the sleeping bag when in use by the homeless.

We are in need of socks, gloves and used sweatshirts, as our inventory has been depleted; both men and women. We meet the second Monday of each month starting in September at 10:00 a.m. and work until 11:45-Noon. Those attending bring whatever they want for lunch; and we rotate bringing a dessert. DID YOU KNOW?

Reading the Bible can be daunting! Have you noticed that two people can read the same passage from scripture and come up with entirely different — and often conflicting--understandings of what they read? Sincere Christians may take what they read literally and apply it to today's circumstances, not taking into account the ancient culture(s) that influenced the writer; at its worst, this has led to social injustices such as support of slavey in the USA, and the historical—and in some denominations continuing--subjugation of women. Yes, as the writer of Hebrews tells us, Jesus Christ IS the same, yesterday, today and forever." (Heb 13:8) But human cultures are not!

It has often been said that the Bible should help the reader to ask questions more than to find answers. So, here are some questions to ask ourselves as we read scripture, particularly New Testament, that can lead us to being in meaningful dialogue with the Written Word, through which we come to know Jesus Christ, the Living Word. As we question and listen and learn, may our hearts be truly opened to the fullness of the Word of God.

Who were the primary audience?

Jews/Gentiles/Followers of "The Way"

(eq, Pharisees? the "crowd" that followed Jesus? Jesus' disciples? early Christians?)

Where did they live? (name of province/town & its location relative to Jerusalem/Rome)

When did they live? (within a generation/two of Jesus' death? Later?)

What were their circumstances? (eg, being persecuted?)

What is the writer's apparent goal(s)?

Telling a story? Evangelism/conversion? Comfort/assurance?

General advice for Christian living? Addressing a specific issue/concern?

What is the writer's tone? (scolding/exhorting/praising etc)

What is the writer's theme?

What words are repeated? What images are used most frequently?

Does the writer refer to any Old Testament scripture?

How is the writer connected to the audience?

From where/whom does the writer draw authenticity/credibility?
