OLD TESTAMENT READING Joel 2:1-2,12-17

Blow the trumpet in Zion; sound the alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the LORD is coming, it is near a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and thick darkness! Liturgist: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love;

People: according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

- L: Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!
- P: For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.
- L: Against you, you only, have I sinned, and done that which is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless in your judgment.
- P: Behold, I was born into iniquity, and I have been sinful since my mother conceived me. R

- L: Behold, you desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart.
- P: Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow;
- L: Make me hear with joy and gladness; let the bones which you have broken rejoice.
- P: Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.
- L: Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.

- L: Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.
- P: Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.
- L: Deliver me from death, O God, God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance.

- L: For you have no delight in sacrifice; were I to give a burnt offering, you would not be pleased.

GOSPEL Matthew 6:1-6,16-21

"Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven.

"So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is

doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

MEDITATION

CONFESSION OF SIN

Celebrant: As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, study, and works of love help us return to that love.

I invite you, therefore, to commit yourselves to love God and neighbor by confessing your sin and by asking God for strength to persevere in your Lenten discipline.

Liturgist: Let us confess our sin before Almighty God. Let us pray.

People: Most Holy and Merciful God, we confess to you and to one another that we have not loved you with all our heart, and soul, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

L: We have been deaf to your call to serve. We have been unfaithful, proud, and hypocritical. We have neglected prayer and worship, and have failed to commend the faith that is in us.

P: Lord, have mercy on us.

L: We have been self-centered, and have taken advantage of others. We have been envious of those more fortunate than ourselves. We have loved worldly goods and comforts too much. We have been dishonest in daily life and work.

P: Christ, have mercy on us.

L: We have been blind to human need and suffering, and indifferent to injustice and cruelty. We have thought uncharitably about others, and we have been prejudiced towards those who differ from us.

P: Lord, have mercy on us.

L: We have wasted and polluted your creation, and lacked concern for those who come after us. We have allowed the political realm to influence our faith in order to achieve its own selfish agenda.

P: Hear us as we call out to you, O God.

MOMENT OF SILENT CONFESSION

Celebrant: Together, let us pray.

Merciful God, we have sinned in what we have thought and said, in the wrong we have done and the good we have left undone. We have sinned in ignorance and in weakness. We here express our sorrow, repent of our ways and turn to you. Forgive us, for the sake of our Savior, Jesus Christ, and renew our lives to the glory of your name.

- 1. Sunday's palms are Wednesday's ashes as another Lent begins; Thus we kneel before our Maker in contrition for our sins. We have marred baptismal pledges, In rebellion gone astray; Now, returning, seek forgiveness; Grant us pardon, God, this day!

BLESSING AND IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Celebrant: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: the early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation.

During this season converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when persons who had committed serious sins and had separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to participation in the life of the Church.

In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Lord, to observe a holy Lent: by self–examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self–denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word.

To make a right beginning of repentance, and as a mark of our mortal nature, let us now bow before our Creator and Redeemer.

(A brief silence is kept, the congregation bowed)

Let us pray:

Almighty God, you have created us out of the dust of the earth. Grant that these ashes may be to us a sign of our mortality and penitence, so that we may remember that only by your gracious gift are we given everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

(Those wishing to receive ashes are invited to come forward)
(Ashes are imposed with these words)

From dust you were made, and to dust you shall return.

And/or

Repent and believe the Gospel.

ASSURANCE OF PARDON

Celebrant: May the almighty and merciful God, who desires not the death of a sinner but that we turn from wickedness and live, accept your repentance, forgive your sins, and restore you by the Holy Spirit to newness of life. Amen.
